Police and Crime Plan – Objective 1 update

1. Purpose

1.1 To share with the Business Coordination Board (“the Board”) the draft update of Objective 1 – “Maintain Local Police Performance” of the Police and Crime Commissioners (“the Commissioners”) Police and Crime Plan (“the Plan”).

2. Recommendation

2.1 The Board approves the updated Plan (as given at Appendix 1) for submission the Cambridgeshire Police and Crime Panel at its meeting on the 5th November 2014.

3. Background

3.1 The original Plan was published in March 2013 and has had three revisions in July 2013, February 2014 and March 2014.

3.2 There have been a number of operational developments over the life of the Plan which are not reflected in the current version.

3.3 The structure of the updated section is as follows:

1. Introduction – an overview of the key points.
2. Community engagement – a section about understanding the needs of local people. This is a new section not previously included.
3. An accessible and responsive constabulary – includes 101, contact points and online.
4. Visible policing – the people element: officers, PCSOs, volunteers.
5. A professional team – supporting staff to be the best. This is a new section not previously included.

- 3.4 In updating the Plan it has been cross referenced with Cambridgeshire Constabulary's Policing Priorities, the People Strategy and the Volunteering Vision to ensure consistency.
- 3.5 To simplify presentation, Key Measures and the Commissioners Pledges remain but the Actions and Outcomes have been removed.
- 3.6 Other sections in the Plan will be updated in the coming months to give the entire document a refresh.
